No.	TOPIC	HIGHLIGHTS
1.	Presentation	Arbonne - Shanon Dryer (Tel. 760-801-2628, shanondreyer@outlook.com , www.shanondreyer.arbonne.com); retired SDSO presentation on First Responder Health and Wellness. Life expectancy for first responders are low, some are not able to enjoy their retirement; due to sickness, time spent at doctor's office, or pass away. First responders go out and put their life on the line and risk their own safety every single day; for people who they don't even know. Arbonne - 30-day program, educate on how to supplement your body with proper nutrition. Focus on gut health, the gut is your second brain and has more neurotransmitters than your brain. This program gets your gut into a more alkaline state, where it builds your immunity levels. Cost of the program is the cost of the supplements.

2.	Old Business	<p>Hot Stop Topic - How agencies are conducting hot stops based on the 9th Circuit Court of Appeals ruled that officers cannot conduct a high-risk vehicle stop, based on reasonable suspicion that the vehicle is stolen.</p> <p>Michael Miranda ~Training on hot stops will be incorporated into SDPD's CPT for year 25-26. As far as tactics in the regional, nothing has changed. Having contact cover and having someone facilitating the stop - a minimum of three coverage, bringing the suspect all the way to the back of the car. Common basic standards of the hot stop are not changing at all.</p> <p>Patrick Dobbins ~Is training differentiating between high risk stop versus hot stops? Weapon down range? Miranda~ that aspect is not going to change. However, what may change is the utilization of K9 clearing the car may be an issue moving forward. Use of force or show of force will still be documented as Use of Force Incident. Guns down rage are documented as use of force.</p> <p>Kevin McCauley ~ SDSO released a training bulletin -standard 10851, based on the LPR hit is not sufficient to have a standard hot stop with guns pointing at vehicle occupants. Instead, legal says it must have one other factor ie slow yield, or reaching around the car, etc. (legal left it open for officer to add a factor) plus LPR hit, confirmed 10851. Escondido is doing holster hot stops, same tactics without the gun point.</p> <p>See attached SO's training bulleting.</p> <p>Supervisory Course - SDSO got approval to add more Supervisory courses. GTA no longer need to become a presenter for course.</p>
3.	New Business	<p>Election results for 2025 Board Members: 16 quorum votes for Pricilla Graton newly elected SDTMA Vice President. 16 quorum votes + 6 emailed ballots = 22 votes for Melody Batuyong returning SDTMA Secretary.</p>

4.	POST Report	<p>Kevin McCauley, SDSO; Went into EDI and added one more presentation for a total of 3 Supervisory Course offerings for year 2025. First one beginning in March.</p> <p>The Use of force train the trainer course a lot of agencies have gone to it. That course is now a part of 1070. Agencies that have the UOF course in their profile or in their course list if you don't have the instructors to teach those courses your courses will be put into modification. Starting in the new cycle in January please sign up your instructors to attend the Use of Force Course. POST will send out flyers soon. Agencies have 2 years till the end of the cycle January 2029 to comply. SB 230</p> <p>The 1070 updates are all the courses that requires instructors' certification. For example if you have an instructor that does Firearms or Arrest and Control 1070 instructor updates every four years per expertise. POST will provide a shell with the criteria for each certification.</p> <p>3 Training Coordinator Courses Chino February, Ontario March and Rockland May. None in San Diego yet. Contact POST if you would like to host in San Diego.</p> <p>FTO Update has to be updated every 8 years.</p> <p>Learning Portal has Vehicle Pursuit back online.</p>
